HANGING COMMITTEE:

The President and Council

THE ROYAL SOCIETY OF BRITISH ARTISTS

"On May 22 1823, certain gentlemen, being artists by profession, met publicly at the Freemasons Tavern in Great Queen Street, Lincolns Inn Fields, to discuss the formation of a new Art Society". This was the first meeting of the Society of British Artists. In 1847 this Society received a Royal Charter and on August 9 1887, it was re-styled The Royal Society of British Artists.

The Founding Members, of which there were 27 and 5 Honorary Members, were most insistant that they did not wish to rival any other Society and every Member . . . "was at liberty to assist and support any other Societies". The British Institution and the Royal Academy were contacted: the King and the Prime Minister were informed. The SBA (as it was then known) was financed by a system of donors not dissimilar to the present Friends of the Royal Academy. When the first £1,000 was raised, John Nash was commissioned to build a gallery in Suffolk Street off Pall Mall. The Haymarket Theatre had just been completed, the National Gallery was not even thought of - such a site in the heart of London with no other Galleries nearby was ideal and this Gallery remained in use until 1971. The First President, Thomas Heaphy, was elected and the first exhibition took place in 1824. This exhibition lasted three months; 220 Non Members exhibited and 754 works were hung. The most popular picture "The Seventh Plague" by John Martin was bought for 500 guineas by Lord Lambton and the Society was off to a good start.

The rules for submission of pictures set up then have remained in force to this day with little change except that in those days there were no submission or hanging fees. Sold pictures were indicated by a black spot — not the universal red spot of today. Women artists — they were increasing in number — were made Honorary Members and were allowed to exhibit with no financial obligation (this practice was not altered until 1902). The hanging of the first exhibition took 15 days and the Hanging Committee were paid a guinea a

day. The Council met daily during the exhibition and were fined half a guinea if they failed to turn up. At the exhibition last year 477 pictures were hung in one day and the hanging committee had a sandwich lunch. This year we have hung 378 and the prizes range from £100 to £5,000.

The aims of the Society were grand; not only to hold exhibitions, but to run an Art School, have lectures and conversazioni - in short, to be a major centre for the Arts Charitable Institutions were invited free; but in 1838 "for fear lest the morale of the children of St Anne's School should be demoralised by too much amusement, the annual visit to the British Artists' exhibition was abandoned that year, since the children already that term had visited the gardens of the Regents Park Zoological Society". The Society grew slowly in Membership, but its exhibitions became more and more successful. In the 1859 exhibition 160 pictures were sold with a total turnover of £4697 4s. The prices ranged from 2 guineas to the most expensive picture "The Confiscation of Sir Walter Raleigh's Estate" by Walter Salter which sold for £262 10s. In 1886 Whistler became President and it is interesting to note how little he charged when he first exhibited; "Arrangement in Black No. 2 Portrait of Mrs Louis Huth" was on sale for only £21 in 1884. During these years many well-known artists exhibited and many Academicians continued to find the Society useful.

Since our last annual exhibition the Society has held two other successful exhibitions. The first at the Yarrow Gallery in Oundle and the second at the Ceri Richards Gallery in Swansea. Once again we will have a musical soirree at the end of this exhibition. There will be painting demonstrations on Saturday 22nd and Sunday 23rd June by members of the Society. We are particularly pleased that Thomas Coates award winning exhibition for the Society's De Laszlo medal coincides with ours and can be seen in the North Gallery.

We would like to thank Daler-Rowney for their generous gift of prizes and the Hammerson Group of Companies and the John Davis-Slade for their support and magnificent purchase prizes.
