### WHISTLER AND THE RBA

(Shortened Version)

According to Albert Ludovici Junior, the young Walter Sickert, then a pupil of Whistler, visited him in 1885 saying that if Whistler were to be invited by the Society of British Artists, he would be prepared to become their President. Ludovici, whose father was then treasurer of the SBA approached John Burr, the President and William Holyoake, Vice-President. "I had much difficulty in persuading them to take the offer seriously" Ludovici recalled, although they both recognised that Whistler could act as an excellent advertisement for the Society. Taking an enormous risk, the Council elected Whistler President on June 1st 1886.

His first task was to redesign the exhibition galleries in Suffolk Street, which was then the Society's home. He stripped off the old patterned wallpaper, painted the walls plain colours, brought in new carpets and yellow curtains for the doors as well as some pieces of Japanese pottery. The number of pictures accepted and hung was greatly reduced, which meant that many artist members suffered what Whistler called "the virtue of rejection". Not all saw their rejection in the same light. He also redesigned the catalogue, which had looked "like a tradesman's book of advertisements".

The experiment was rejected the following year as a resolution in the Minute Book for June 1887 proposed:

"That the experiment of hanging the pictures in an isolated manner be discontinued and that the Committee be instructed to fill the line spaces with pictures and to accept sufficient works to cover the space below the line and at least one row above the line" Whistler was forced to get the furnishings he had lent the Society returned; he also refused to show his own works in the old fashioned decor.

Whistler also took charge of the guest list for the Private View, being critical of the fact that members either failed to turn up or invited "people whose presence would seem to bring about the flight into the mountains of the members themselves." The archive contains one of Whistler's lists written in his own hand in December 1887 and amongst his guests are Mr and Mrs Oscar Wilde, Lady Colin Campbell and Lord and Lady Randolph Churchill. We also know that, thanks to Whistler's personal contact, the Prince and Princess of Wales attended one RBA Private View.

In addition to bringing in society and establishment figures, Whistler invited 'progressive' artists to send in their work, in particular Claude Monet whose Impressionist seascapes caused something of a sensation. Older members resented the intrusion and blamed poor sales on this policy. In fact Europe suffered a serious recession in the mid-1880's which accounts for the lack of sales.

1887 was Queen Victoria's Jubilee and the SBA decided to explore the possibility of obtaining a Royal Charter. Whistler took the matter into his own hands, writing, producing and illustrating a leather-bound Address which he sent to The Queen. The Royal Charter was granted and Council Minutes record:

"that the best and most hearty thanks of the meeting be accorded to the President for his sincere and successful efforts in obtaining the title of "Royal Society of British Artists" and for the great trouble and time given by Mr Whistler in preparing the Memorial to Her Majesty." Some members, however, felt that they had been left out and resented Whistler's undemocratic methods. Whether the SBA could have become the RBA without Whistler is debatable; he was known and respected by the Prince and Princess of Wales and this must have had some influence. As President of

a Royal Society, Whistler was invited to review the Fleet at Spithead on July 27th 1887, (the invitation is in the archive) and attend ceremonies at Westminster Abbey and the Royal Academy.

Whistler was very proud of his achievement and now proposed that members of other societies should be banned from joining the RBA. This proposal was rejected, and he moderated it to prevent them from holding office at the RBA. Again there were long and acrimonious discussions and finally his opponents gathered their supporters and at a Council Meeting on May 7th 1888 tabled a letter signed by 8 members asking the President to call a special meeting to discuss the proposal "That Mr J McNeill Whistler be requested to resign his membership of the Society". This meeting was held on Saturday 12th May and Whistler survived by just one vote while the dissidents including William Holyoake, Augustus Weedon, George Cattermole and Thomas Bush Hardy resigned from the Council. However at the AGM on 4th June 1888 Wyke Bayliss was elected President and the dissidents returned to their Council posts. Some 25 Whistler supporters resigned, mostly young and progressive artists including Mortimer Menpes, Theodore Roussel, Aubrey Hunt, Albert Ludovici, Francis James, Sidney Starr and J.J. Shannon. The outgoing President had to remain in office until December, and one can imagine the poisoned atmosphere in Council Meetings where Whistler referred to the President Elect as "Mr Baillie".

A few days after the election, Whistler gave an interview to the St James's Gazette:

Lattempted to bring about a sense of esprit de corps and ambition, which culminated in what might be called 'my first offence' – by my proposition that members belonging to other societies should hold no position in ours. I wanted to make it an art centre, they wanted it to remain a shop. "It was a hard fight then?"

"My dear sir, they brought up the maimed, the halt, the lame and the blind . . . they brought up everything but corpses, don't you know."

"But all this hardly explains the bitterness of the feud and personal enmity to vou"

"What? Don't you see? When I took charge of the ship I found her more or less waterlogged. Well, I put the men to the pumps, don't you understand, and thoroughly shook up, you know, the old vessel; I had her re-rigged, recleaned and painted, don't you see – and finally I was graciously permitted to run up the Royal Standard at the masthead, and brought her to the fore, ready for action . . . And as a natural result mutiny at once set in!"

The question remains as to whether Whistler actually achieved anything during these turbulent years. The RBA returned to its old ways dominated by a clique of now-forgotten painters such as Horace Cauty, Wyke Bayliss and Walter Morgan.

But many years later Ludovici recalled:

"In spite of all that has been said, Whistler took an immense interest in the Society. Young artists of the present day have much to thank Whistler for. They would be surprised to learn what a struggle it was to bring about any reform, or change, in the way of hanging a wall of works of art." But possibly the most memorable result of the whole affair is the often-quoted and typically Whistlerian comment made after his supporters resigned from the RBA:

"And so you see, the "Artists" have come out and the "British" remain – and peace and sweet obscurity are restored to Suffolk Street! Eh? What? Ha-ha!"

After the close of the exhibition, and only after payment of the purchase price, the work will be handed to the purchaser, or his agent authorised in writing, on application at 17 Carlton House Terrace, London SW1Y 5BD.

Any purchase effected by or with the artist direct must at once be notified to the Keeper and these rules complied with; otherwise a sale effected by the Society shall take precedence and supercede one made privately.

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
